than insoluble compounds. Inhalation of fumes may cause sore throat, coughing, labored breathing, and irritation of the respiratory tract as well as the above symptoms.

Subacute to chronic toxicity: No effects known.

Subacute to chronic toxicity:

Isopropyl alcohol, if formed, may act as a local irritant and in high concentrations as a narcotic with symptoms such as headache, nausea, dizziness, vomiting,

mental depression, anesthesia, and coma. Similar symptoms may be caused by ingestion. It can cause corneal burns on contact with the eyes and has caused

teratogenic, mutagenic and reproductive effects in laboratory animals.
